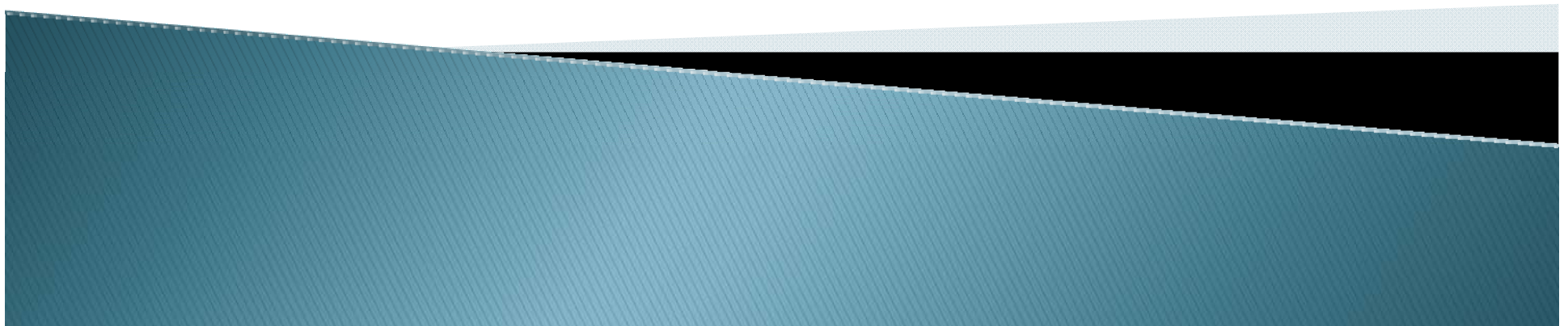

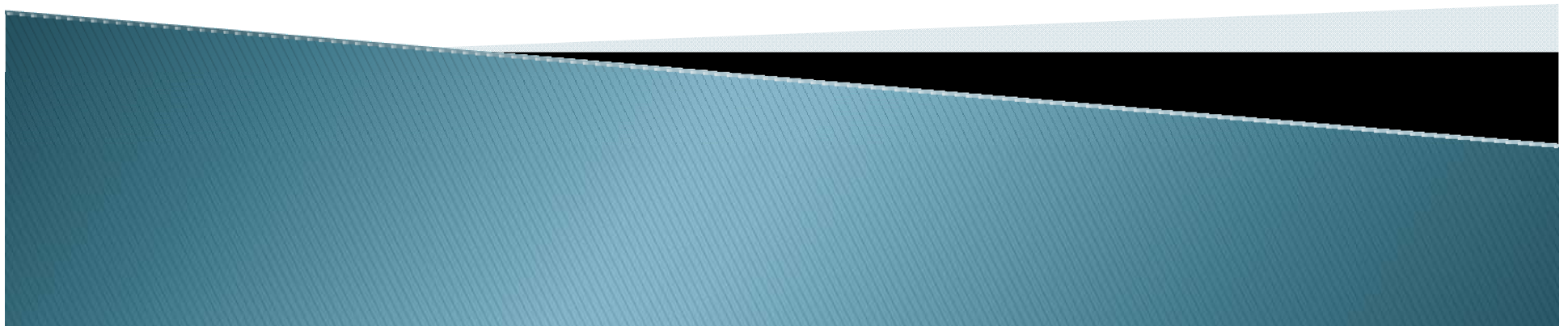

Growing numbers of peer-reviewed research journals are opening-up their content online, removing access barriers and allowing all interested readers the opportunity of reading the papers online, with over 3300 such journals listed in the DOAJ, hosted by Lund University Libraries in Sweden.

Dear Commissioner,

Our mission of disseminating knowledge is only half complete if the information is not made widely and readily available to society.
Berlin Declaration, October 2003

In January 2006 the European Commission published the Study on the Economic and Technical Evolution of the Scientific Publication Markets of Europe. The Study resulted from a detailed analysis of the current scholarly journal publication market, together with extensive consultation with all the major stakeholders within the scholarly communication process (researchers, funders, publishers, librarians, research policymakers, etc.). The Study noted that 'dissemination and access to research results is a pillar in the development of the European Research Area' and it made a number of balanced and reasonable recommendations to improve the visibility and usefulness of European research outputs.

Now, a year after publication of the Study, we urge the EC to endorse the recommendations in full. In particular, we encourage you to adopt the first recommendation as a matter of urgency:

RECOMMENDATION A1. GUARANTEE PUBLIC ACCESS TO PUBLICLY-FUNDED RESEARCH RESULTS SHORTLY AFTER PUBLICATION

Research funding agencies have a central role in determining researchers' publishing practices. Following the lead of the NIH and other institutions, they should promote and support the archiving of publications in open repositories, after a (possibly domain-specific) time period to be discussed with publishers. This archiving could become a condition for funding.

- Approved: 14 June 2002
- Name: DARE, Digital Academic Repositories
- Period: 1 Jan. 2003 – 31 Dec. 2006
- Budget: M€ 5.9
- Partners: All universities, KNAW, NWO and KB

1st milestone: DAREnet

- ▶ 2004
- ▶ All repositories connected & searchable
- ▶ Initially 17.000 publications (Today 600.000)

2nd Milestone: Cream of Science



- ▶ 2005
- ▶ *Idea* : Complete oeuvre of 10 top scientists per DARE participant
- ▶ Subset of DAREnet

Cream of Science Details

- ▶ 15 Institutions
- ▶ 207 authors (187 male, 20 female)
- ▶ 40.479 records = 195/author (from 3 to 1224)
- ▶ 23.853 full text = 58.7% (from 19% to 96% per institute)
- ▶ 25% copyright obstructed, 15% only metadata available at the moment, 2% lost

**3d Milestone:
HunDAREd Thousand**



- ▶ *Idea:* to have 100.000 OA publications (of which 10.000 doctoral theses (PhD) under the name Promise of Science) to DAREnet
- ▶ 2006

Mandates



2010: Rotterdam University

“The Executive Board and your dean **expect you** to deposit the final author's version in RePub within at most six months after its publication. RePub will ensure that storage conforms to the requirements of your publisher.”

RePub = institutional repository

Utrecht University

“Utrecht University **recommends** that the publications of Utrecht scholars be deposited into the Utrecht repository, the Igitur Archive.”


In concrete terms, this means that Utrecht University will stimulate the delivery of the publisher versions of publications via Metis to the Igitur Archive.”

- Metis = research registry system
